Introduction

- 1. Council Regulation (EU) 2017/2063 ("the Regulation") imposing financial sanctions against Venezuela has been amended.
- 2. Identifying information for the individuals listed in the Annex to this Notice has been amended.

Notice summary (Full details are provided in the Annex to this Notice)

3. 16 entries have been <u>amended</u> on the consolidated list and are still subject to an asset freeze:

What you must do

4. You must:

- i. check whether you maintain any accounts or hold any funds or economic resources for the persons set out in the Annex to this Notice;
- ii. freeze such accounts, and other funds or economic resources;
- refrain from dealing with the funds or assets or making them available (directly or indirectly) to such persons unless licensed by the Office of Financial Sanctions Implementation (OFSI);
- iv. report any findings to OFSI, together with any additional information that would facilitate compliance with the Regulation;

- v. provide any information concerning the frozen assets of designated persons that OFSI may request. Information reported to OFSI may be passed on to other regulatory authorities or law enforcement.
- 5. Where a relevant institution has <u>already reported</u> details of accounts, other funds or economic resources held frozen for designated persons, <u>they are not required to report</u> these details again.
- 6. Failure to comply with financial sanctions legislation or to seek to circumvent its provisions is a criminal offence.

Legislative details

- 7. On 13 November 2020 Council Implementing Regulation (EU) 2020/1696 ("the Amending Regulation") was published in the Official Journal of the European Union (O.J. L 381, 13.11.2020, p.8) by the Council of the European Union.
- 8. The Amending Regulation amended Annex IV to the Regulation with effect from 13 November 2020.

Former Commander General of the Bolivarian National Guard. <u>Promoted to General in Chief of the Bolivarian National Guard in August 2020</u>. Responsible for the torture of political prisoners and repression of <u>the democratic opposition in Venezuela, including the prohibition and repression of political demonstrations</u>. **Listed on**: 22/01/2018 **Last Updated**: 04/08/2020 13/11/2020 **Group ID**: 13580.

2. GONZALEZ LOPEZ, Gustavo Enrique

DOB: 02/11/1960. **Position**: Head of the Bolivarian National Intelligence Service (SEBIN), reappointed on 30 April 2019 **Other Information**: Gender: male. Formerly Security and Intelligence Adviser for the President's office from 8 January 2019 to 30 April 2019. Head of SEBIN until October 2018. Responsible for arbitrary detention, inhuman and degrading treatment, torture, and the repression of civil society <u>and the democratic opposition in Venezuela</u>. **Listed on**: 22/01/2018 **Last Updated**: 04/08/2020 13/11/2020 **Group ID**: 13581.

3. LUCENA RAMIREZ, Tibisay

DOB: 26/04/1959. Position: President of the National Electoral Council (Consejo Nacional Electoral (CNE)) Other Information: Gender: female. President of the National Electoral Council (Consejo Nacional Electoral (CNE)) from April 2006 until June 2020. Failed to ensure that the CNE remained an impartial and independent institution in accordance with the Venezuelan Constitution. Facilitated the establishment of the Constituent Assembly and re-election of Nicolas Maduro in May 2018 through presidential elections that were neither free nor fair. 4. MORENO PEREZ, Maikel Jose

statements that have usurped the authority of the National Assembly, <u>including the appointment of the National Electoral Council (CNE) in June 2020 and the suspension and replacement of the leadership boards of three opposition parties in June and July 2020. 5. EL-AISSAMI MADDAH, Tareck Zaidan

6. SUAREZ CHOURIO, Jesus Rafael

Former Chief of the General Staff to the Commander-in-Chief. Former General Commander of the Venezuelan Bolivarian National Army. Former Commander of Venezuela's Comprehensive Defence Region of the Central Zone (REDI Central). Responsible for the use of excessive force and the mistreatment of detainees. Targeted the democratic opposition and supported the use of military courts to try civilian protestors. Listed on: 26/06/2018 Last Updated: 04/08/2020 13/11/2020 Group ID: 13683.

7. RODRIGUEZ GOMEZ, Delcy Eloina

Former Vice President of the National Electoral Council (CNE). Former President of the Commission of the Electoral and Civilian Register. Facilitated the establishment of the illegitimate Constituent Assembly and manipulation of the electoral process. Listed on: 26/06/2018 Last Updated: 04/08/2020 13/11/2020 Group ID: 13690.

9. HERNANDEZ HERNANDEZ, Socorro Elizabeth

DOB: 11/03/1952. **Other Information**: Gender: female. Member (Rector) of the National Electoral Council (CNE) <u>until 12 June 2020</u> and member of the National Electoral Board (JNE). Facilitated the establishment of the illegitimate Constituent Assembly and the manipulation of the electoral process <u>in relation to a cancelled presidential recall election in 2016, postponement of gubernatorial elections in 2016, and the relocation of polling stations at short notice before gubernatorial elections in 2017. **Listed on**: 26/06/2018 **Last Updated**: 04/08/2020 13/11/2020 **Group ID**: 13695.</u>

Facilitated the establishment of the illegitimate Constituent Assembly and manipulation of the electoral process. Listed on: 26/06/2018 Last Updated: 04/08/2020 13/11/2020 Group ID: 13696.

11. ESCALONA MARRERO, Alexis Enrique

Chief in Charge of the National Office Against Organized Crime and Terrorist Financing (ONDOFT) from January 2018 until May 2019. National Commander of the National Anti-Extortion and Kidnapping Command (Comando Nacional Antiextorsion y Secuestro (CONAS) between 2014 and 2017. Responsible for torture, excessive use of excessive force, the mistreatment of detainees, and repression of civil society. Listed on: 27/09/2019 Last Updated: 04/08/2020 13/11/2020 Group ID: 13794.

13. GRANKO ARTEAGA, Alexander Enrique

16. NORIEGA FIGUEROA, Jose Gregorio

The election took place while entry of several parliamentarians to the premises of the National Assembly was blocked by military police, and without a quorum being reached. In July 2020, Noriega, helped by the Venezuelan Supreme Court of Justice (Tribunal Supremo de Justicia (TSJ)), illegitimately took over the leadership of the political party Voluntad Popular, thereby further undermining democracy in Venezuela.
